About this report

The PRI Reporting Framework is a key step in the journey towards building a common language and industry standard for reporting responsible investment (RI) activities. This RI Transparency Report is one of the key outputs of this Framework. Its primary objective is to enable signatory transparency on RI activities and facilitate dialogue between investors and their clients, beneficiaries and other stakeholders. A copy of this report will be publicly disclosed for all reporting signatories on the [PRI website](#), ensuring accountability of the PRI Initiative and its signatories.

This report is an export of the individual Signatory organisation's response to the PRI during the 2013-14 reporting cycle. It includes their responses to mandatory indicators, as well as responses to voluntary indicators the signatory has agreed to make public. The information is presented exactly as it was reported. Where an indicator offers a response option that is multiple-choice, all options that were available to the signatory to select are presented in this report. Presenting the information exactly as reported is a result of signatory feedback which suggested the PRI not summarise the information. As a result, the reports can be extensive. However, to help easily locate information, there is a **Principles index** which highlights where the information can be found and summarises the indicators that signatories complete and disclose.

Understanding the Principles Index

The Principles Index summarises the response status for the individual indicators and modules and shows how these relate to the six [Principles for Responsible Investment](#). It can be used by stakeholders as an 'at-a-glance' summary of reported information and to identify particular themes or areas of interest.

Indicators can refer to one or more Principles. Some indicators are not specific to any Principle. These are highlighted in the 'General' column. When multiple Principles are covered across numerous indicators, in order to avoid repetition, only the main Principle covered is highlighted. This results in some Principles not being explicitly highlighted. For instance, Principle 1 and 2 cannot be implemented without implementing Principle 3, but there are cases when Principle 3 is not explicitly highlighted.

Whenever a new fund is closed, an Advisory Committee is appointed and consists of representatives of the main investors as designated by Access. The Advisory Committee is consulted by Access as often as necessary on potential and actual conflicts of interest, which Access identifies, and on any other matters as provided for by the By-Laws or determined by Access. Access' funds' Advisory committees meet twice a year.

Besides, Access systematically provides full transparency to its investors as to all mandates or funds it manages. Whenever a new mandate/client is signed or a new fund is closed, Access determines (together with the relevant client or advisory board) the parameters for fund allocations. In any case, Access keeps the advisory committee members and clients of its funds and mandates informed of all investments Access makes and of the allocation process.

Actions have been made through the following events:

1/ Due diligence process

GPs are strongly encouraged by Access to adopt responsible investment practices: an SRI engagement questionnaire is sent to every GP under due diligence to find out whether and how they take ESG criteria into account in their decisions related to their investment in private companies.

Further, in the legal documentation, Access seeks a written engagement from underlying GPs to use reasonable best efforts to incorporate ESG aspects to the management of their portfolio companies and to provide update if significant ESG issue arises in a portfolio company.

2/ Lifetime of the underlying funds

Board seats at Advisory Committees: By being systematically represented at the Advisory Committees of the underlying primary funds, Access has the opportunity to i/ question on how the GP has integrated ESG issues into their investment decisions, ii/ ensure adequate governance structure is in place, iii/ encourage GPs to report on the application of their own ESG policies.

GP Meetings: Every year, Access gathers its small to midmarket buy-out and special situations GPs to exchange views on the current state of the market. On this occasion, Access reiterates its commitment to UNPRI and encourages GPs to report on the application of their own SRI principles.

Each GP/fund under due diligence is provided with a statement explaining Access' commitment to the Principles for Responsible Investment. In addition, a specific Socially Responsible Investment questionnaire is sent to the fund management team. The questionnaire purpose is to find out whether, and how, private equity funds under due diligence take ESG criteria into account in the decisions related to their investments in private companies. Inadequate responses do not necessarily result in a decision not to invest since the GP will have to recognize, through a side letter, the Access' commitment to the PRI Principles and use reasonable best efforts to incorporate ESG criteria to the management of the fund. When selecting a GP, Access pays much attention to potential and willingness from the GP to integrate ESG over the long term. The SRI questionnaire is then analyzed by Access and leads to the first specific rating for each GP/fund. Thus, before going further in the selection and the investment process, Access is aware of the orientation of the GP/fund concerning SRI.
